CAPEL CHRIST, in the Cwmwd of Mab Wynion, Cantref of Y Gastell (now called the Hundred of Moeddyn), Co. of Carbiars, South Wales: a Chapel, not in charge, dedicated to The Holy Cross. It is 15 m. N. W. b. N. from Llan Bedr. It is situate on the Bay of Cardigan.

From Luit Beilt. 11 is fruitable in the Say Cardigan.

CAPEL COEBERN, in the Cwanwel of Llywel, Cantrel Mawr (now called the Hundred of Delynoc), Co. of Barcarooca, South Wales; in the Parisk of Ystrad Gyslais: a Carey, not in charge, of the certified value of £1: Pariso, The Rector of Ystrad Gyslais. This Clapel was rebuilt, in 1959, entirely as the expense of Mr. Weller Piers, of Gyna, Liele, who possesses that the Company of the Compa

CAPEL CURIG, in the Cwmwed of Llechwedd Uchai, Cantref of Abertow called the Hundred Uchai), Co. of Castrawov, North Wales: a Chapel, not in charge, to the Rectories of Linn Degai and Linn Llechid; and dedicated to St. Corrig. The Money raised by the Parish Rates for this Chapelry, in 1805, is included in the Return made from Linn Degai. It is 5 m. W. b. S. from Linn Rwst. According to the Disceans Report, in 1809, the yearly value of this Benefice, arising from Sipnends from the Rectors of Linn Degai and Linn Llechid 23.1.0, Bounty (Linn) 2651, uncertain, and Surplice fees 22.1. was 22.8.1.0. it is though, that this part of the county It is 1 m. S. W. from Brechnock. It is situate upon the river Adult, which joins the Adult a Broot Neath Engalson. The scenery here is particularly with and picturesque. This Gursey has neither Gleth House, nor Gleth. There are eight Fairs annually in the little village of Pont Neath Engalson, viz., on the first Saurday shefer the 18th of March, Saurday before the 18th of Mays, Saurday before the 28th of August, 18th of Sepsenber, and 14th of November. The Bridges in Virtual Fellis are respicied entirely by the Inhabitants of the Parish, except that at Pont Neath Englan, to which the Parishioners of Goldstons, in the County of Ginnorgen, contributes proportion; but as this Bridge is of general Utility and Public convenience, it is recommended by a sensible Writer to be widened and kept in repair by the two Counties. It is 21 m. S. W. from Brecknock. This is a very extensive Parish. It is situate on the river Tawe. Upon the Hills, adjoining the County of Caermarthen, are several Carnaddau. The Bridges in this Parish, except that at Abr Grdf which is upon the County, are repaired by the Inhabitants of the District. The Rector of Ystrad Gynlais nominates to the Curacy of Goale Coebbran.

YSTRAD MARCHELL, in the Cwmwd of Ystrad Marchell, Castref of Ystly cow called the Lower Division of the Hundred of Gurn, O.o. of Mostroesexy, North Wales; in the Parish of Welsh Pool. It is situate on the banks of the river Sezers, in the Township of Gyngrog Fawr. See, Whith Pool.—It A Cistertian Abbey was founded here to the Honour of God and the Blessed Virgin, A.
